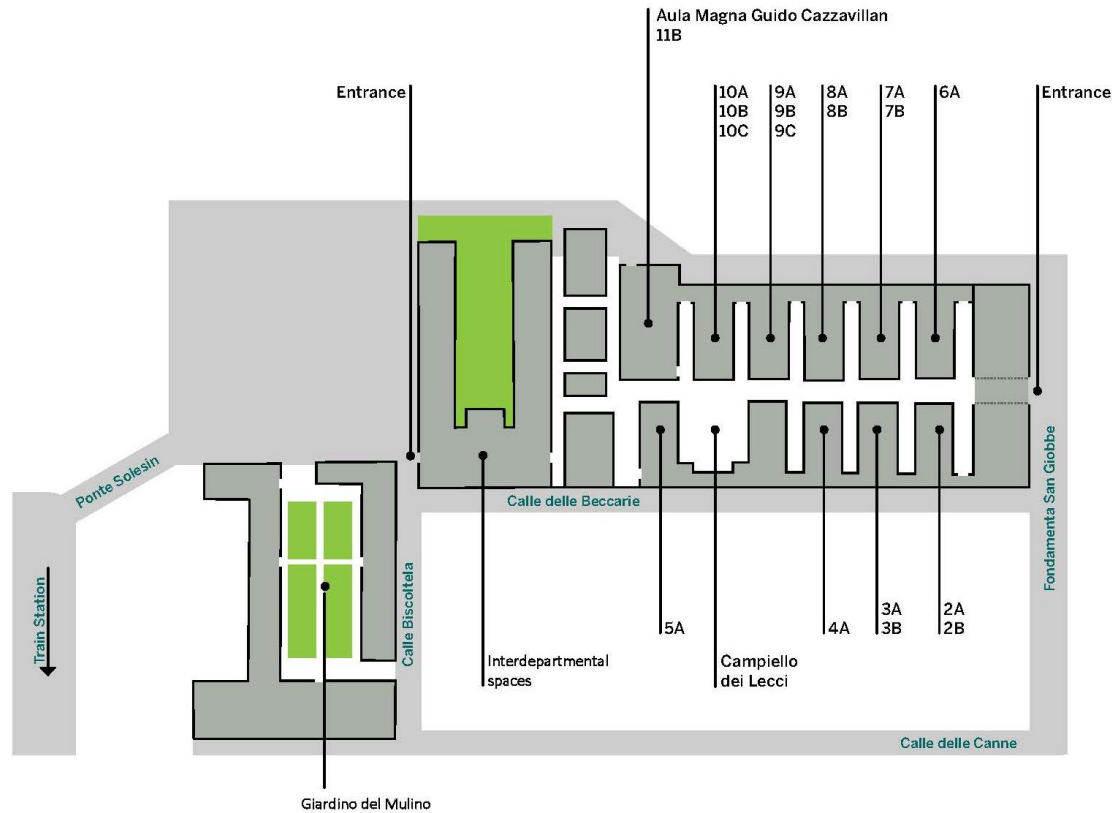

San Giobbe Economics Campus

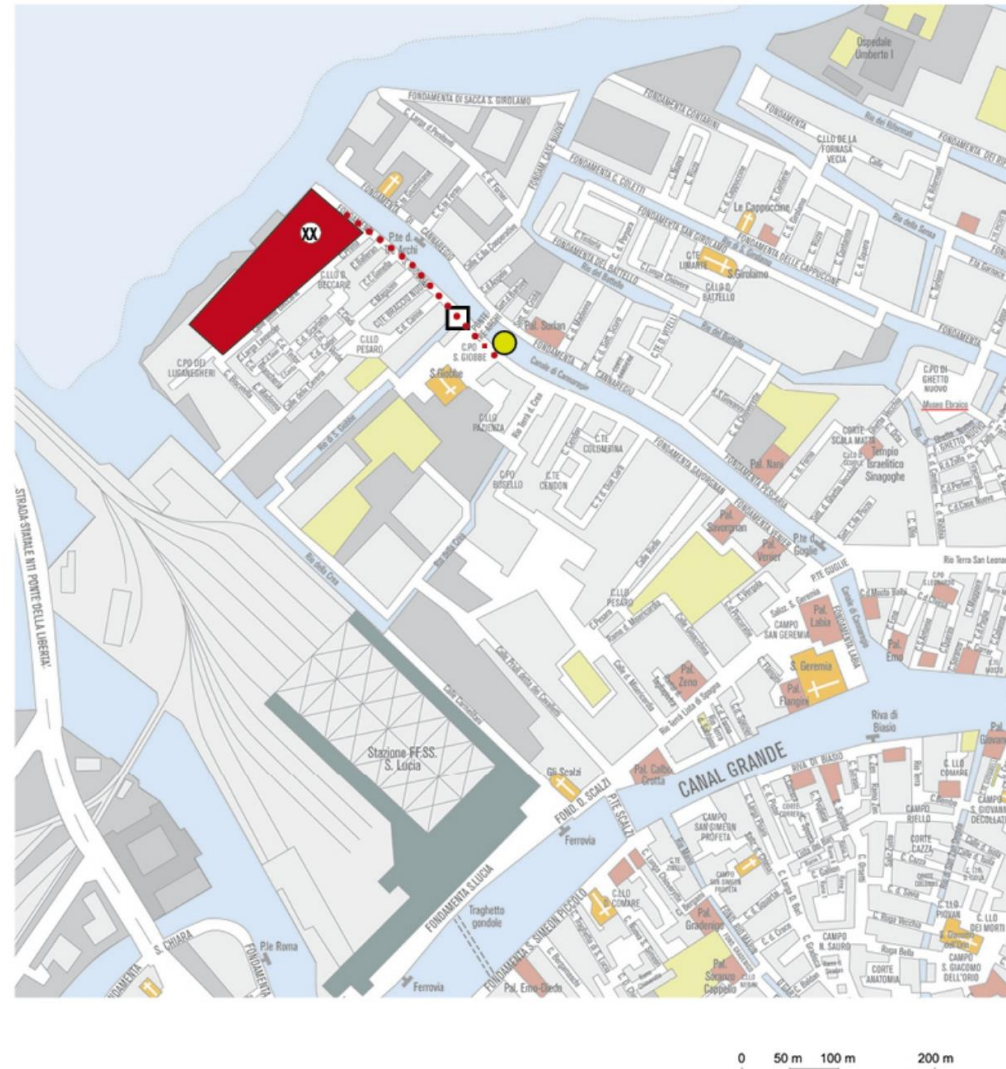

Accessible route 1 - Valeria Solesin bridge

- After entering the station, go to Platform 1.
- Go down the platform following the signs “San Giobbe Exit – University” and turn right when the signs tell you to.
- Take the first (and only) street on your left and follow it all the way to the Valeria Solesin Bridge.
- After crossing the bridge, follow the ramp and turn left.
- You will find yourself in front of the back entrance to the San Giobbe Economics Campus.
- On your right you will see the entrance to the garden and the library area.

Accessible route 2 - Fondamenta San Giobbe

- Take Waterbus Line 4.2 (usually only one wheelchair on board at a time, at the captain’s discretion) from the Ferrovia or Piazzale Roma stops, and get off at Crea.
- Turn right along Fondamenta San Giobbe.
- Cross the (non-wheelchair accessible) bridge, then continue along the Fondamenta.
- The entrance to the San Giobbe Campus is on your left, at the end of the Fondamenta.



Getting to Venice by plane



Arrival at "[Marco Polo](#)" airport in Venice (VCE)

- From the airport you can reach Mestre or Venice (Piazzale Roma) by land (on a bus or taxi) or take the water route to Venice (Alilaguna boat or water taxi).

Arrival at "[Antonio Canova](#)" airport in Treviso (TSF)

- From the airport you can reach Mestre or Venice (Piazzale Roma) by land (on a bus, train or taxi)

Getting to Venice by train and by car

For more information about public transport in Venice please visit [AVM](#), company of the Municipality of Venice, holder of service contracts for Local Public Transport (TPL) throughout the municipal territory and the metropolitan city.

AVM provides an integrated service of bus public transport which connects Venice Island and Mestre (the mainland Venice Area) and waterbus public transport to move in Venice Island and the other islands of the Venice Lagoon.

Venice Access Fee

Starting in spring 2024, Venice will introduce a booking system and an entry fee for day trippers: visitors not staying in accommodation in Venice overnight (and residing outside the Veneto region) will have to book online and pay a fee of €5 during the peak tourism periods of the year (those sleeping in accommodation in Venice already pay a tourist tax).

Please note that there are [cases for exemption](#) from paying the access fee, but to obtaining the appropriate exemption voucher is required to benefit from the exemption:

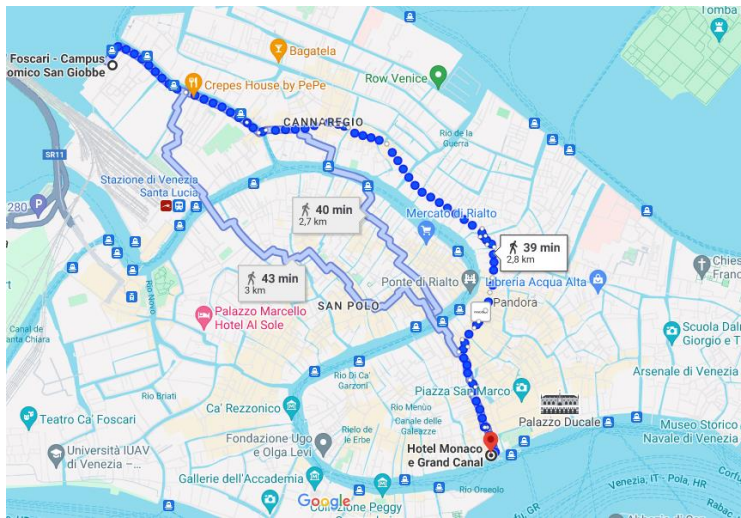
- [guests in an accommodation facility located in the Municipality of Venice;](#)
- residents of the Municipality of Venice and individuals born in the Municipality of Venice are excluded from paying the access fee, they are not required to obtain the exemption voucher and can prove their exemption status by presenting a document certifying it;
- minors under the age of 14 are excluded from the payment of the access fee: to prove their age, if it is not apparent, the presentation of an identity document is accepted as sufficient proof;
- holders of the European Disability Card and their accompanying caregivers are entitled to the exemption from the Access Fee by presenting their card without the requirement of registration on the Portal.

The Municipal Administration may carry out checks, inspections and site visits through authorized personnel, in the main points of access to the City.

Fine from 50 euros to 300 euros (+10 euros of the entry fee), with the possibility of reporting under the Italian Criminal Code and special laws on the subject to anyone who makes false declarations, and falsification of documents in the cases provided for by the Regulation.

How to reach the Hotel Monaco & Grand Canal for your social dinner

Hotel Monaco is located in a historic building from the early 1600s located in the heart of Venice, a few steps from St. Mark's Square, its Basilica and the Doge's Palace.



The Hotel Monaco can be reached from the San Giobbe Economic Campus by a walk through the city of Venice of about 40 minutes: see the [walking route here](#).

Alternatively, it can be reached by vaporetto (no. 2) from the Ferrovia stop (in front of Santa Lucia railway station) to the San Marco Giardinetti (Vallaresso) stop, [sailing along the Grand Canal](#).
